What's this about?

Taranaki Catchment Communities (TCC) is developing Catchment Action Plans shaped by the people who live and work in each catchment. These plans set a shared direction — highlighting what matters locally, what's already happening, and where working together can make the biggest difference.

What is Integrated Catchment Management (ICM)?

ICM takes a whole-of-catchment approach — from mountains to sea (ki uta ki tai). It connects land, water, biodiversity, climate resilience, and community needs to focus on actions that deliver the greatest long-term benefit.

Why it matters

- Aligns farmers, communities, councils, and funders around shared priorities
- Focuses on outcomes, not isolated projects
- Helps track progress across the whole catchment
- Keeps local voices at the heart of decision-making

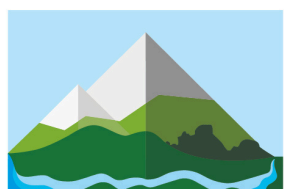
