What is Integrated Catchment Management (ICM)?

ICM takes a whole-of-catchment approach – from mountains to sea (ki uta ki tai). It connects land, water, biodiversity, climate resilience, and community needs to focus on actions that deliver the greatest long-term benefit.

Why it matters

- Aligns communities, farmers, hapū, iwi, councils, and funders around shared priorities
- Focuses on outcomes, not isolated projects
- Helps track progress across the whole catchment
- Keeps local voices at the heart of decision-making
